• Aim:

In the "Reiwa" Era of Japan, we need to prepare for both types of disasters, Nankai Megathrust Earthquake and Tokyo Metropolitan Earthquake which occur "definitely someday" AND meteorological disasters which come "frequently." On the other hand, Japan is facing the population getting more aging. It is necessary to invent a new way for promoting community-based disaster management from both of the hard and soft aspects.

The symposium invites Mr. Hideki KAJI (Professor Emeritus, University of Tsukuba) to address a keynote. He played an important role as the leading person in studies on urban disaster management and now he is promoting community-based disaster management as a leader of a community-based voluntary disaster management organization. He will present clues to promote community-based disaster management based on communities' unique characteristics by integrating academic and local knowledge. Following his speech, Mr. Toshiro MATSUMOTO (Mayor, Kuroshio Town in Kochi Prefecture) will introduce advanced cases on community-based disaster management against Nankai Megathrust Earthquake in Kuroshio Town. Then Mr. Katsuo SASAHARA (Director of the Center for Disaster Prevention Promotion, Kochi University) will show roles of universities against sediment disasters and for community-based disaster management. At the end, discussion among participants will be made on how we should promote community-based disasters management in the "Reiwa" Era.
